SUBJECT: SORTS Reporting Option for TA 902, Patient Decontamination
Augmentation Set (HQ ACC/SG Ltr, undated)

HQ ACC/SG request to use SORTS reporting option one for Table of Allowance (TA) 902A, Patient Decontamination Augmentation Set is approved for all commands assigned this program.

For clarification, option one is the "status quo" methodology. Medical logistics accounts will load new levels, establish prime/substitute relationships, and report SORTS from material availability percentages contained in the WRM Stock Status Report. This option is most appropriate since the old TA does not meet new requirements for wartime medical decontamination.

SUBJECT: SORTS Reporting Option for TA 902, Patient Decontamination Augmentation Set

1. Request approval to use SORTS reporting option 1 for TA 902A, Patient Decontamination Augmentation Set for all commands assigned this program. SORTS reporting option 1 instructs the bases to load the new TA and report the resulting material availability percentage. TA changes were released in July via the Air Force Medical Logistics Letter.
2. FY97 WRM funds have been allocated to modernize 25 of the 39 patient decontamination packages. The commands and bases that have received funds are as follows:

PACAF	Elmendorf, Misawa, and Osan

AMC	McGuire, MacDill, McConnell, Charleston, and McCord

ACC	Shaw, Minot, Langley, Holloman, Mountain Home, Davis-Monthan, Moody, Nellis, and Seymour Johnson

3. For the 14 bases that did not receive funds the equipment and supply availability percentages will significantly fall below 80 percent. The old TA has problems and does not meet the new requirements of the Wartime Medical Decontamination Team Concept of Operations. SORTS reporting option 1 will easily identify these units for planning and budgeting purposes. With the next allocation of WRM funds in October 1997, additional funding will be requested and prioritized.
