## MEDICAL MATERIEL

### New MEDLOG Processing Information on Excise Tax

The Balanced Budget Act of 1997 modified vaccine excise tax rates. The manufacturer, producer, or importer of the vaccines imposes the excise tax on a per-dose basis. The excise taxes for many vaccines were reduced by enactment of this bill. At the same time, this bill added coverage for a number of new vaccines not currently taxed (i.e. Haemophilus influenza type B bacteria (Hib), hepatitis B virus and varicella (chickenpox) virus. The excise tax rate currently authorized varies by vaccine. The cost is a flat tax rate of \$0.75 per dose of vaccine component. For example, the combination vaccine M-M-R will be taxed at \$2.25 (\$0.75 x 3 components) per dose, whereas the DT combination will be taxed at \$1.50 (\$0.75 x 2 components) per dose. Some vendors (i.e. Merck & Co., Inc.) may reflect this tax on their invoice as a Federal Vaccine Injury Tax.

Process the receipt through MEDLOG as you would any other local purchase item. However, when you process an order for an item with an associated federal excise tax, **add the cost of the excise tax in with the unit cost of the item. Basically, they should be treated almost the same as F.O.B. Destination transportation costs. This will insure orders placed using the IMPAC card will reflect correctly in finance. This is a change from previous instructions with the intention of putting the cost of the excise tax on the user of the vaccine.**

In summary, you should process federal excise taxes in basically the same method as you process routine transportation on an F.O.B. Destination

document. The price of the item **must include** the excise tax. The vaccine excise tax rates is now a flat tax of \$0.75 per dose of vaccine component. ### **Reminder of Requirements at End of Fiscal Year (FY)**

The end of the FY is quickly approaching. This is a reminder to ensure all medical logistics accounts complete all actions required to close out FY 99.

All WRM monies must be spent by the end of FY. When EOFY is run, all PFSRs in MEDLOG will be zeroed out. If you have any money you can't spend, AFMLO/FOC-A needs to know immediately.

At the end of the FY, your RMO must establish a miscellaneous obligation reimbursement document (MORD) account to cover anticipated price increases and the LP surcharge for items that are on backorder. Establishing the MORD ensures sufficient FY 99 O&M dollars will be available to cover backorder releases in FY 00. To calculate your MORD, use the following factors:

- When calculating the MORD for your local purchase (LP) backorders, multiply the prices by 3.5%. The result will be the MORD amount for your LP backorders.
- When calculating the MORD for depot-stocked backorders multiply the prices by 11.5%. The result will be the MORD amount for your depot-stocked backorders.

When the results of both "A" and "B" above are added together, the result will be your total MORD amount for FY 99.

You are required to ensure that medical materiel and finance reports are reconciled and reporting

true, accurate, and identical figures at the EOFY. To accomplish that, it is imperative you provide the September BMSO/BAFO Financial Reconciliation Report (page 3 only), MEMO/BAFO Financial Reconciliation Report, Monthly DIF and EOFY Finance Transaction List to your finance office as soon as possible after it is produced at September EOM. Finance uses the Finance Transaction List to complete coordination on all PFMR and RC/CC changes. Finance uses the DIF file to reconcile due-in and due-out totals, plus the PFMR. E-mail or overnight mail is appropriate.

AFCSM 41-230, Volume 2, Section 24, paragraph 24.7.2 states "the closing balances on the 30 September report (MMMR) must agree with the BMSO/BAFO Financial Reconciliation balances before BAFO can run the end-of-fiscal year programs." AFM 177-383, Chapter 9, paragraph 9.3.7b states "The MMMR report and the MDSF trial balance must always be in agreement. The user must reconcile the Medical Expendability Code 1 and Medical Expendability Code 2 parts of the MMMR report to the BMSO/BAFO Financial Reconciliation List produced by MEDLOG." The ending balances on the MMMR pages 1 and 2 and General Ledger Account 130 must agree with the ending balances reflected on page 3 of the BMSO/BAFO Financial Reconciliation Report as of 30 September.

Ending on-hand balances on the MEMO Equipment Summary portion (page 7) of the MMMR must be reconciled to ending on-hand balances on the MEMO/BAFO Financial Reconciliation Report.

It is absolutely necessary for you to work closely with your Defense Accounting Office to ensure any differences result in corrections to the MMMR and Trial Balance.

Any PFMR and RC/CC changes required should be made at EOFY with finance. Close coordination is needed to ensure finance makes the appropriate changes before the start of the new fiscal year.

The Medical Dental Division Fund Cite for FY 00 remains (97X4930.FCOB.6B.\*\*\*\*\*).

The local purchase surcharge rate for FY 00 will remain at 2.1%. The local purchase surcharge is

used to recover losses to the Medical Dental Division of the Air Force Working Capital Fund.

DSCP has not announced the (DVD) surcharge rate for FY 00. AFMLO will generate a separate message to advise of changes in depot surcharge rates as soon as we receive the information.

### **Y2K Compliance of Medical Logistics Computers and Ordering Systems**

Many questions have been raised about the Y2K status of Medical Logistics computers and ordering systems. The following is a brief update on their Y2K compliance and information on a web site for you to obtain updates. The DMLSS web site for updates is:

Once at the web site, click on the Y2K link to view/print items. Since ordering medical supplies is a critical process, please file all Medical Logistics Systems Y2K documentation with your facility's Risk Management Plan for rapid reference. The MEDLOG computer system was certified as compliant in December 1998.

The DMLSS Program Management Office (PMO) is currently performing end-to-end testing with all Medical Prime Vendors (PV). Testing will include both the DMLSS DOS PVI and the new DMLSS platforms and all interfaces. The dates that are part of the test are: Baseline date (1 Jul 99); 30 Sep 99; 1 Oct 99; 31 Dec 99; 1 Jan 2000; 28 Feb 2000, 29 Feb 2000; 31 Dec 2000 and 1 Jan 2001. The testing is expected to be completed by 15 September 1999. After the testing, DMLSS PMO will send a disk out to all the DMLSS DOS PVI sites to ensure all sites have loaded all updates correctly. A letter will be attached referencing the Y2K compliance of the DOS PVI as well as Prime Vendors' order entry systems.

DMLSS provided workstations have been tested for Y2K compliance. All workstations are compliant with some requiring manual intervention. Please review the web site for specific details.

DSCP does have Y2K compliance letters for all PVs. Additionally, all PVs are finalizing contingency plans. All activities should work with their PVs to ensure preparation, test, and documentation of contingency plans for manual ordering of medical materiel should automated systems fail or be otherwise impacted by Y2K.

### **The Need for Good Data**

As we approach the time for WRM Centrally Managed (CM)/Centrally Procured (CP) Equipment validations, we are requesting all FM accounts review their information and ensure its accuracy in MEDLOG. We have found many disconnects and will identify necessary corrections upon discovery. Some of the problems we are discovering from the SMI files for an abundance of accounts are:

*Incorrect Function Identifier-* CM/CP items are being cataloged as Medical and Non-Medical items; the correct information can be found in the UDR Management section. As a result of these miscodings, items are erroneously requisitioned in MEDLOG with incorrect due-in document numbers (i.e. all funded CM/CP document numbers will have 0470-0499 document number series assigned to them).

*Levels with no requirements-* Many projects are showing levels on items but have no valid requirements, or have a requirement but do not have proper levels established. All requirements are now calculated by using the Medical Resource Letter. FM accounts can obtain the projects and allowance standards assigned to their unit from their Readiness department or their MAJCOM. All of the levels can be verified and updated by reviewing the Allowance Standards web site (<http://www.medicine.army.mil/afmlo/foc-o/as/main.cfm>), once you know which projects are assigned to your account. Also, we have found some misleading detachment information for some projects. This could also be corrected upon reviewing information from the MRL and contacting your MAJCOM.

*Nomenclature-* We have noticed that some items are identified by two or three different nomenclatures for different FM accounts. This may seem minor but it could lead to confusion when the nomenclatures are very different or result in excess which we are not able to redistribute. For example, one FM account may have an excess of an item and we are trying to find another FM account that has a requirement for that item under a different nomenclature. We ask that you please compare your CM equipment nomenclatures that are loaded in your MEDLOG with the nomenclatures loaded in FEDLOG or the UDR, then validate with the CM/CP Validation List once when you receive it and correct by processing the BRR transaction.

We ask you to please review your records for possible disconnects and update your records as needed. You will find this will help assist with your annual CP validations. We now have a new, single e-mail address for all Centrally Managed (CM), centrally procured equipment issues at "CMCP\_Equipment@ft-detrick.af.mil". This distinct point of contact will eliminate confusion regarding who to contact for resolving issues relevant to CM/CP assets and provide a true "one-stop shopping" experience for you, our customers. With improvements in technology and the need for rapid responses, this specific address provides visibility to all members of the CM staff, regardless of TDY, leave, or other commitments.

While each member will still provide individualized service and perform required follow-up to ensure our customer's concerns are personally addressed, this feature will allow constant monitoring of incoming messages and improve tracking and follow-up of all requests. Our goal for response time is to provide an answer, or an estimated response date if detailed research is required, within 2 duty days of receipt of any message, 100% of the time.

Additionally, accounts will receive communications regarding equipment procurement plans, quality assurance messages, manufacture or distribution delays, status responses, contract award information, due-in notifications and cancellations, and MEDLOG data disconnects. During the next few months, we will continue to enhance our service further by providing web access to the above mentioned information as well. ## ***Contracting Corner***

### **Medical Contracting Courses**

Do you know the difference between a Personal and a Non-Personal Service contract? Are you aware that the contract type in effect can be changed by the way the contract is administered, not a good thing. Health care is one of the very few areas in which a Personal Service contract is allowed. Improper contract administration techniques can lead to huge problems.

AFMSA/SGSLC offers two courses designed to aid your Quality Assurance Evaluators (QAEs) Medical Logistics personnel, and Contracting Officer's Technical Representatives (COTRs) in administering the contracts assigned to them. The first course is the Tricare COTR Training course, a tri-service offering for the COTRs for the Managed Care Support Contracts.

When Tricare was first established in 1994, each lead agency was responsible for providing training to the COTRs. This resulted in training that varied in length, objectives and quality.

In April 1996, the services and OCHAMPUS formed a DOD Tricare COTR working group to develop a standard COTR training course.

The resulting course, alternately hosted by the Army, Navy and Air Force is offered every 4 to 6 months. The Army hosted one in San Antonio (Region 6) in April, the Navy at Fort Detrick MD in July (Region 1) and the Air Force will host one in Oct at Wright Patterson (Region 5). The course emphasizes the non-traditional roles COTRs for the Managed Care Support Contracts play. Partnering skills, problem solving, communicating, facilitating are emphasized in lieu of heavy-handed contract enforcement. The three-day course covers Regulations, COTR Functions, the Uniform Contract Format, Character of Services, Contract Types, Modifications and Delivery Orders, Surveillance Methodology, Remedies and Legal Issues. Instructors for the course are Mr. Rodney Stevenson, United States Army Medical Command at DSN 471-7067; Mr. Gilbert Hovermale, Naval Medical Logistics Command at DSN 343-3015; and Mr. Frank Conaway, Air Force Medical Support Agency at DSN 240-8044.

The second course offered is the Medical Contract Administration Workshop course designed for the QAEs and Medical Logistics personnel. This is a two-day course normally taught at Lackland AFB on an as needed basis. Subject covered are: Proper Care of Your Contracting Office, Regulations, Acquisition Process, Appropriation Law, Character of Service, Contract Types, Uniform Contract Format, Statement of Work and Quality Assurance Surveillance Plans, Modifications, Remedies and A-76/Direct Conversion.

## **Notice of Contract Award for Basic Core Formulary (BCF) and National Mail Order Pharmacy (NMOP) Formulary Pharmaceutical Agent**

The Department of Defense Pharmacoeconomic Center, in cooperation with Defense Supply Center Philadelphia, announced the award of a DOD contracted pharmaceutical agent. The agents are HMG CoA reductase inhibitors (statins), see **Attachment 1**.

### **This contract is a committed volume, mandatory use contract.**

Although the contract states a 1 October 99 ordering start date, the contractor has voluntarily offered its contract price beginning 1 Sep 99.

Logistics officers are advised to coordinate with pharmacy to make the necessary changes for acquisition. **THIS IS NOT THE ONLY MANDATORY USE PHARMACEUTICAL CONTRACT!** Other required use contracts for pharmaceuticals (proton pump inhibitors, lisinopril, amoxicillin, etc.) are listed on the AFMSA/SGSL web site at:
