## MEDICAL MATERIEL

### Allowance Standard (AS) Updates

**Attachment 4** contains AS updates. Changes are the result of cataloging actions to replace Acquisition Advice Code “V” and “Y” NSNs and changes generated by the Offices of Primary Responsibility. These changes are provided to update your WRM records. Remember to establish prime-substitute (P&S) relationships when applicable. Use the information in the “Add” and “Replaced” portion of the change document to determine the need for P&S relationships. If an NSN is replaced and there are on-hand balances, a P&S relationship should be established. Adjust WRM levels on NSNs listed

as “Add” or “Delete”. If you have any questions or concerns, contact the appropriate AS manager. A list of the AS managers and the current version of each AS is available on the AFMLO web site under the Medical Combat Support Operations Team option. Only minor changes are contained in this attachment and no SORTS reporting option is required. Any SORTS reporting option required as a result of a major AS change will be provided in the Transition Plan coordinated between the Pilot Unit, MEFPAK, and HQ USAF/SGXR. ## **Introduction To Defense Medical Logistics Standard Support (DMLSS) Customer Support On The Web (CSW)**



CSW is a web-based stand-alone Intranet/Internet application that gives the user access to DMLSS, streamlining the process of performing catalog searches and customer ordering for the internal and external customer. This enhanced application provides the ability to create/follow-up on New Item Requests (NIR); search/view detailed product information for pharmaceutical or medical surgical items; and replenish stock. In addition, internal customers can submit work requests to Facility Management (FM) online. These features will be available in Release 2.02, beginning the week of 14 Oct 00.

To access CSW, you will need to get a login and password from your System Administrator (SA) in medical logistics. Internet Explorer (IE) 4.01 or Netscape 4.5 is the minimum browser requirement for access to CSW. IE is the preferred browser because it contains all necessary components to effectively run CSW.

To access CSW open your Internet browser, enter the Uniform Resource Locator (URL) provided by the SA, accept the DOD security warning, and log on. Contact your SA for assistance if you experience any difficulties. ### **Joint Control Number (JCN) System**

Until recently, when assigning a temporary number (referred to as a “placeholder” NSN) to a new item pending NSN assignment in an allowance standard (AS), the Air Force Equipment

Management system (AFEMS) required the suffix "MD" be added to identify it as an Air Force medical action. This placeholder number system has been adopted as a Tri-Service system and is now called the Joint Control Number (JCN) System. The JCN system continues to be developed with the goal of a seamless system from initial item entry by the requestor, through the standardization process, to NSN input to the Service's assemblage system.

During the JCN development process, the "MD" suffix was causing problems in existing Service systems and for data input to the UDR.

AFEMS agreed to a 13-position number with "NCM" in the fifth through seventh positions. As a result, placeholder NSNs in AF assemblages had both the old placeholder NSNs and the new JCN number.

In order to ensure a consistent numbering system, we processed changes to convert all placeholder NSNs to JCN numbers. You can view the list of converted numbers on our web site at [afml.ft-detrick.af.mil/afmlo/foc-o/as/mdchgs.txt](http://afml.ft-detrick.af.mil/afmlo/foc-o/as/mdchgs.txt).

We are currently working with the Standard Systems Group at Gunter AFB, AL to see if a batch MEDLOG file will process these NSN changes (SPZ). As soon as we know if this can be accomplished, we will post it to our web site. You can delay processing individual NSN changes (SPZ) until we resolve this question.

### **Defense Reutilization and Marketing Office (DRMO) and Federal Agencies Access to Excess**

In May, significant excess materiel was reported at Shaw AFB. On 21 Sep 00, the items were turned-in to Defense Reutilization and Marketing Office (DRMO), approved by GSA for turnover to Indian Health Services (IHS). DRMO approved "in-place" turn in, allowed IHS to pack the items, and the materiel was flown out of Shaw AFB by TRANSAM for delivery to IHS. This was accomplished with full DRMO coordination and met all documentation and approval requirements of DoD Regulation 4160.21.M, Defense Materiel Disposition Manual and Air Force Regulations.

CMSgt(s) Manning, ACC, contacted AFMLO regarding the use of interested federal agencies (IHS and the Humanitarian Assistance Program, (HAP)) to reduce MTF excess workload and maximize redistribution to needing federal agencies. From our investigation, we contacted the HAP and IHS. IHS subsequently became aware of the materiel scheduled to become available upon completion of the mandatory 75-day reporting period through the AFMLO excess program (25 July 00). It is DRMO's responsibility to find a taker for items turned into them. In this case, DRMO's processes improved with good DRMO communication.

Suggestions:

- 1) Coordinate excess turn-in with DRMO only. Do not go directly to federal agencies with information on available excess.
- 2) Good coordination with the local DRMO is vital. Supply your DRMO with a list of items coming available 30 days prior to the completion of the 75-day mandatory reporting

period. This lead-time will allow them to more effectively find an interested federal agency. Interested parties MAY offer their services to pick up the item and coordinate an “in-place” DRMO turn-in (do not skip).

- 3) Follow-up with DRMO 15 days prior to disposition to get results on their search for interested agencies.
- 4) You may combine items on a single 1348-1 summing to less than \$2500 per form by grouping in the following manner:
  - a. Group by Federal Stock Class (FSC), unit price must be \$100 or less.
  - b. Group by Federal Stock Group (FSG), unit price must be \$50 or less.
  - c. Group without regard to FSC or FSG, unit price must be \$35 or less.

**Responsibilities:**

- a. DRMO - Collects materiel and searches for federal agencies interested in available materiel.
- b. GSA - If IHS/other Federal Agencies are interested parties, GSA approves the distribution to interested parties.
- c. HAP - Work with DRMO to find items and submit paperwork to DRMO for access to items

### **Prime Vendor Medical/Surgical Generation II Transition**

The Generation II Medical/Surgical Prime Vendor contracts are finalized and Generation I to Generation II transitions begin in the Cascades Region on 20 Oct 00 and will continue through Jul 01. Most bases have already attended meetings to select either Allegiance or Owens & Minor as their Prime Vendor.

The Joint Medical Logistics Functional Development Center (JMLFDC) and the Defense Supply Center Philadelphia (DSCP) have been working together to minimize the turbulence associated with changing vendors. For those with a DMLSS Prime Vendor interface (PVI),

JMLFDC developed an application that converts the Prime Vendor Order Numbers (PVON) in the DMLSS database from the old vendor's numbers to the new vendor's numbers. This automated process saves many man-hours and will provide a series of conversion reports. Please review these reports carefully and you will know exactly what needs to be done for each PVON in the translation table. Approximately four weeks prior to transition, DMLSS will run a practice conversion, without changing your data, and provide you a list of PVONs which cannot be automatically converted by the DMLSS application.. You will have to research each item and manually change these PVONs on the transition date. If your current vendor is retained, there is no PVON conversion issue. You will also receive a package of detailed DMLSS system change information approximately two weeks before transition. A JMLFDC PVI team member will work with you to make necessary system changes for the new contracts. Typically, the process takes one day. Once complete, a test order will allow fine-tuning of the PVI and DMLSS. For those with a DOS PVI, manual translation table maintenance will be required to change to the new PVONs..

Another important transition process is the review of usage data by your facility. DSCP will distribute to you, through the Regional Logistics Chiefs, a file containing 6 months of Prime Vendor reported sales history. You are required to validate the data and return it to DSCP at least 60 days prior to your DMLSS Transition (“Go-Live”) date. Accuracy of this information is critically important as it will be used by the prime vendor to establish stock levels for your facility's PV purchases. As stated in the contract, the vendor must have 30 days to bring the items into stock.

The Service Level Election Form is due through the Regional Logistics Chiefs to DSCP 60 days prior to the DMLSS Transition “Go-Live” date. It validates ordering point/delivery point address information and allows each facility to choose service options available in the contract. Remember, if you select anything other than a basic level of service, it may have an impact on your logistics manpower. Your selections can be changed at the 10 month point of the contract. For details on the various service options, select

### **Pharmaceutical PV Short Pays out of Credit/Rebate Accounts**

There has been a recent wave of Pharmaceutical Prime Vendors (PV) charging Rebate/Return credit accounts for short pays. A Short Pay occurs when the total price of the PV invoice is greater than the sum of receipts (PNDs) run under a single call number. Short pays most commonly result when the PV is not notified of a shipping discrepancy within 24 hours as specified in the contract. When the PV is unaware of the discrepancy, they do not decrease the value of the invoice. Subsequently, instead of working through Defense Supply Center Philadelphia (DSCP) to rectify the problem, PVs are charging credit accounts for Short Pays. This is an unacceptable practice per the contract.

As a solution to the problem, bases should ensure all discrepancies are communicated to the PV within 24 hours. Also, review your Rebate/Return Credit Account from the PV to ensure it is not happening to you. Your effort will reduce the amount of research required by DSCP for short pays and you will have better visibility of your credit account.

As a note, maintaining visibility of credit accounts is vital to ensure you are spending your credits

within 90 days and will prevent you from losing. After 90 days, your PV is required to send the unused credit dollar amount to the US Treasury. (AFMLO/FOM-P, Capt Jason Ortiz, DSN 343-4168, commercial 301-619-4168, [jason.ortiz@ft-detrick.af.mil](mailto:jason.ortiz@ft-detrick.af.mil))

### **Multiple Award Contract for Transcription Services**

The Naval Medical Logistics Command (NMLC) contracting office has awarded multiple award task order indefinite delivery/indefinite quantity (IDIQ) contracts for providing medical transcription services effective 1 October 2000. These task order contracts are available for use at any CONUS DoD military medical treatment facility (MTF). Contract pricing is in the 12-15 cents per line range. Contract services provide for "remote" transcription services using a touch-tone phone and 800 number to record the dictation into an automated system provided by the contractor. The contractor will then perform the transcription from their own location and "electronically" deliver the transcribed documents to the facility. Electronic delivery of the transcription could include remote entry directly into the Composite Health Care System or simply emailing the transcribed document in a word processing format. If any Air Force facility is interested, a task order can be issued in 3-5 days and services can begin 2-4 weeks later. ### **Defense Logistics Management System (DLMS) Change 37**

Defense Logistics Management System (DLMS) Change 37, "In-transit Control of Shipments to DRMO," has been approved and becomes effective on 1 November 2000. This change will affect all stock record accounts. It was driven by Government Accounting Office criticism of services in-transit visibility programs. In essence, it provides a system where the logistics activity must report all items taken to DRMO and respond

### Reminder – DBPA Call Numbers

Effective 1 Oct 00, the FY portion of the DBPA number for DSCP and VANAC DBPAs will change from 00 to 01. The DBPA numbers should read DLA120-01-A-XXXX, SP0200-01-A-XXXX or VA0200-01-A-XXXX. For DBPAs awarded by the AFMLO VASS contracting office, the DBPA number remains the same throughout the life of the agreement. In addition, the numbering of the first call issued after each fiscal year change will revert to 0001.
